
Ready to fly away with our superheroes and discover their superpowers? Go to Room 3! *These words are explained in the glossary at the end of the booklet.

SuperFarel and SuperCalvin have an English friend, SuperKnox. He is famous for his scary "trumpet call"!


SuperKnox blew too hard in his trumpet, and now it's all bent out of shape.


ROOM 4 - THE GRAND SALON

Protestant: a person who follows Protestantism

Protestantism: a Christian church founded by Martin Luther and John Calvin,

who thought that life should be based on the the Bible

Reformer: a person who wants to introduce new ways of thinking

and new beliefs

Refugee: a person who flees their home country to find safety elsewhere **Religion:** a set of religious beliefs and practices shared by a group of people

Theology: the study of religion and sacred texts

Wars of religion: a series of wars between Protestants and Catholics

that took place in Europe in the 16th and 17th centuries
